During 2022-23, the Board met its legislated requirements through the development and implementation of the TAFE Queensland Strategic Plan 2020–24 and the submission of the TAFE Queensland Operational Plan 2022–23. The Board conducted a comprehensive review of the Strategic Plan in 2023 with the Plan updated to reflect TAFE Queensland's current key objectives and strategies. The Board also continued its strong advocacy regarding the second Innovate TAFE Queensland Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) 2021-23 and key programs including the First Nations Employment Initiative. The Board also supported the official launch of the TAFE Queensland Scholarship Foundation and the Foundation's ongoing work in securing donations, sponsorships, partnerships and grants to ensure the sustainability and expansion of TAFE Queensland's scholarship program.</p> <p>Through these plans and activities, the Board reinforced its commitment to the Queensland Government's objectives for the community regarding the delivery of sustainable and responsive training services for Queenslanders.</p> <p>In 2022-23, the TAFE Queensland Board held 10 ordinary meetings, one extraordinary meeting and five committee meetings.</p>
